



Plan a social event.

An activity for 6-8 students

Kia ora!

Your challenge is to plan a social event for your year group. You have a maximum budget of \$5,000 for your event.

STEP 1: BRAINSTORM

Get together as a group and brainstorm ideas for your social event.

Once you have decided on your idea, review the planning considerations (right) to help you get started with planning your event.

STEP 2: GET PLANNING!

Start researching the expenses you'll need to pay for your event. To help your money go further, check if shopping around could reduce some of your costs.

See our handy budgeting tips for more ideas on how to calculate your expenses, and save some money.

STEP 3: CREATE YOUR PLAN

Complete tasks 1-3 on the following pages to show us your plan. You'll need to tell us about your social event, explain how you've budgeted for it, and show us your itemised budget.

TIP: To really catch our judges' attention, show us your creativity and bring your idea to life. You could create a video pitch, or make a 'vision board' using images - it's up to you!



STEP 4: SUBMIT YOUR PLAN
